# INFORMATION FROM THE FCC LEADERSHIP TEAM REGARDING EVANGELICAL COVENANT CHURCH'S GATHER '19 - ANNUAL MEETING, JUNE 26-29, 2019

In the Evangelical Covenant Church (ECC), the Annual Meeting is the highest governing authority. For the first time in our denomination's history a motion will come to the Annual Meeting for the involuntary dismissal of a member church. This pathway of involuntary dismissal was anticipated by the framers of the ECC Constitution and Bylaws, but up to this time has never had to be exercised. This highlights the critical nature of our participation in our denomination's Annual Meeting. Please take a moment to read the following from the ECC Executive Board.

"On behalf of the Evangelical Covenant Church (ECC) Executive Board, with a heavy heart we present this recommendation regarding First Covenant Church of Minneapolis (FCCM):

"Because FCCM is and remains out of harmony with the ECC after all steps required or allowed by Section 4.4 of the ECC Bylaws and attempts to bring the congregation back into harmony have been unsuccessful, the Executive Board of the ECC recommends to the 134th Annual Meeting that FCCM be involuntarily dismissed from the roster of ECC churches."

This matter comes before you after several years of ECC and Northwest Conference leadership working with FCCM's leadership team and pastor in attempting to restore harmony. That significant effort has been to no avail, which leads to this most unfortunate but necessary motion.

In summary, the Executive Board has determined that FCCM is out of harmony by contravening the ECC in five areas:

- 1. The ECC's standard of marriage by eliminating its heterosexual nature;
- 2. The ECC's prohibition of clergy officiating and participating at same-sex weddings;
- 3. The ECC's requirement that clergy adhere to a personal behavioral standard of celibacy in singleness and faithfulness in heterosexual marriage;
- 4. The Covenant's guideline and expectation that congregation refrain from hosting same-sex weddings and related events;
- 5. The determination of the Board of Ordered Ministries by locally credentialing a pastor whose ECC credentials were removed for cause."

FCCM will have opportunity to defend themselves at the Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting will then vote upon this motion. Please be in prayer for our delegates and our denomination.
